- Anti-Bullying Week - 15-19th November - the theme is 'One Kind Word'
- Children in Need - Friday 19th November - the theme is 'Be Yourself'

Pupils and staff will be taking part in a number of activities during the week to explore and fundraise for both campaigns as we recognise their importance for the wellbeing of our school and wider community. During next week all pupils will take part in tailored tutor time sessions which will involve raising awareness and celebrating each pupil as an individual. We will also look to raise money to donate to Children in Need in the following ways:

2. Secondly there will be a pupil vs teacher basketball match on Friday at lunchtime. All pupils are encouraged to spectate and cheer on their chosen side. The suggested donation for spectating is 50p. Pupils and teachers taking part will be encouraged to collect sponsorship.
