Re: Human Papilloma Virus (HPV) vaccination e-consent

The Children and Family Health Surrey Immunisation team is visiting your child's school on **Friday 16th September 2022** to give the HPV vaccination to year 8 students.

The HPV vaccine is given in two doses, 6 to 24 months apart. The e-consent form covers both doses. Further information about this vaccine is available on the [Gov.uk website](#) and the [Electronic medicines compendium \(emc\) website](#)

- If you do not want your child to receive a vaccine, then please fill in the 'No' box.
- If you are completing the e-consent before 31 July 2022 for the next school year please select year 7. If you are completing the e-consent after this date please select year 8.

An automated email will be sent to you on completion of the e-consent form from Cinnamon Digital Applications (who host the website). If you do not receive this, please check in your junk email or contact the Immunisation team.

If you have any concerns or would like to withdraw your consent please contact the Immunisation team on the telephone number or email above.

Measles, Mumps, Rubella (MMR)

By now your child should have had two doses of MMR to fully protect them from the diseases of MMR. If your child has NOT had two doses of MMR, and you would like them to be protected, please complete the MMR consent form. Article 6 (1) (e)

For the performance of a task carried out in the public interest or in the exercise of official authority.

Article 9(2)(h)

Necessary for the reasons of preventative or occupational medicine, for assessing the working capacity of the employee, medical diagnosis, the provision of health or social care or treatment or management of health or social care systems and services on the basis of Union or Member State law or a contract with a health professional.
