



Message from Mr McKenzie

I write to you as the sun sets at the end of the summer term at Kings. In the blink of an eye, it seems, we find ourselves nearly a year older and hopefully a little wiser.

This has been a year of continued growth at Kings.

From a facilities perspective, we have opened our new gym and baseball diamond, giving our students ever greater facilities and opportunities. Over the next 12 months we have secured funding to start a large project to replace our pitched roofs, which require some significant work. These events take months of planning in order that they feel truly special for our students.

Alongside these events, we've had another tremendous sports day led by Mr Chalmers and his PE team as well as exciting Year 6 transition days led by Miss Hamilton. We are looking forward to welcoming our new Year 7s into the Kings family in September.

As is always the case in any school, we bid a very fond farewell to a number of staff. Mr Bland moves to a different role at Kings International in Camberley, Miss Cherry sets sail for the states, Miss Imison leaves to take on the role of Director of Performing Arts at a prep school and Mr Colomb leaves to take on the role of Assistant Principal at Blenheim. As leaders, and as a wider school community, we thank them for their work and wish them all great success in the next stages of their professional and personal lives.

Despite the local and national staffing shortages in education, I am delighted to say we are fully staffed with subject specialists for September. As a growing school we have been recruiting strategically since Christmas, and have some exciting teaching staff joining us in September, some already well known as they have been working or training here this year. My team and I are excited about the professionalism, expertise and enthusiasm they will bring to Kings and I am certain that your children will thrive under their tutelage.

Of course, whilst this point of this term is an ending for some, it is also a time of new beginnings – with Year 6s having finished their time in primary school and preparing to start their secondary journey with us here.

Year 10 made a start on their GCSE design and make projects in June when the contextual challenges were released by the exam board.








Attendance Update 2022-23

Congratulations to all of our students who have achieved 100% attendance this year. They have been at school every day for 190 days – that's a fantastic effort!

Our attendance highlights this year are as follows:



Attendance Housekeeping

Where possible, appointments should be made outside of the school day to maximise the time spent learning. If this is not possible, please ensure you advise us in advance and provide evidence, such as, an appointment card, text or letter confirmation. These should be emailed to <u>office@kingscollegeguildford.com</u>.

If you need to report your child as absent from school, please use the Studybugs app <u>https://studybugs.com/about/parents</u>. Over 93% of parents already use the app, but please download it if you are yet to do so.

A reminder to parents and carers that if you take your children out of school, without permission from the Principal, for five or more days (which do not have to be consecutive), you will be liable to receive a penalty notice.

Currently, the amount payable, under a penalty notice, is £60 per parent/carer, per child, if paid within 21 days. Thereafter, the amount increases to £120, if paid between 21 and 28 days. If the penalty notice remains unpaid after 28 days, the Local Authority will consider a prosecution in the Magistrates Court.

Rewards Update

Whilst reflecting on students' accomplishments and celebrating achievements at the end of the year, it is also important to recognise how hard our students have worked all year round.

We have had a total of 31,185 rewards issued this year, each point signifying where a student has either worked hard, been kind, supported the community or displayed excellence. These numbers are amazing and reflect an average of 185 student rewards received each day this year.

A Message from Innovate

We have gained a well-deserved reputation for never compromising on quality, portion size, choice or value, which is why we are proud to be serving so many students across the country.

The challenges we're seeing in our kitchens are the same as those you're likely experiencing at home. Ingredient prices are rocketing, and energy costs are sky high. Additionally, we're funding important wage increases for our teams. Here's some background information that we would like to share with you.



Food Inflation is at 16.5%

As is the case for supermarkets and restaurants across the UK, we're seeing near weekly increases in the prices of food and drink. Supply volumes have dropped, due to factors such as the invasion of Ukraine, bird flu, swine fever and extreme weather internationally, driving prices up. We're working closely with our chefs and supply partners to introduce new products and dishes, but these mitigations have limits.

Staff Wage Increases

The Government has increased the minimum wage by 9.7%. This is a positive move that will mean our teams are better able to address the cost pressures they are under. It is 3% higher than last year's record rise, which is great progress, but does subsequently create funding pressures.

We have absorbed some of the cost increases and continue to seek further efficiencies, however, we need to implement a tariff increase of 6.6% from September 2023. This is a below inflation increase, which will allow us to maintain quality services and support our catering teams. The situation is far from ideal, we would like as many students to enjoy our services as possible and we appreciate price increases make this harder, particularly when many families are feeling the effects of high interest mortgages and the general cost of living crisis. That said, we believe our food continues to offer excellent value for money.

As always, thank you for your support and understanding. We will continue to partner with schools, students and parents to explore new approaches and gain input and feedback as we navigate this challenging period.
